
Instructional Improvement Plan




Putting the tenets into practice....

2016-2017 Board of Education Goals

- Goals require monitoring and reflection.
- ▶ Data is the key component of the process.
- ▶ In order to be more effective, we need to analyze not only what the data provides but the data itself.
- ► This activity will get us thinking about the data we have available to us and how we can best utilize that data to meet the needs of our students.
- ▶ With a partner, brainstorm all of the data sources we have at our disposal that should be considered for reviewing our goals.

- Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent to conditionally approve the appointment of **Sheila Green-Callen**, who holds Professional New York State Teaching Certificates in Early Childhood Education (Birth Grade 2 and Grade 1-6) and a bachelor's degree in Spanish to the full time position of Teacher in the Spanish and Elementary tenure areas, for a three (3) year probationary period to commence on October 10, 2017 and end on October 10, 2020. Eligibility for tenure at the end of the probationary period is dependent on **Sheila Green-Callen** receiving APPR ratings of Effective or Highly Effective in 2 of the 3 preceding years and no Ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year. The expiration date of this probationary appointment is tentative and conditional only. In order to be eligible and considered for tenure, the teacher must meet all requirements of education law and corresponding regulations. The salary will be paid in accordance with the salary schedule outlined in the collective bargaining agreement with the Allegany-Limestone Teachers' Association and the Board of Education in the amount of \$52,948, prorated, based upon Schedule B, Step 14.
