Healthy Catt. County – School Policy Recommendations

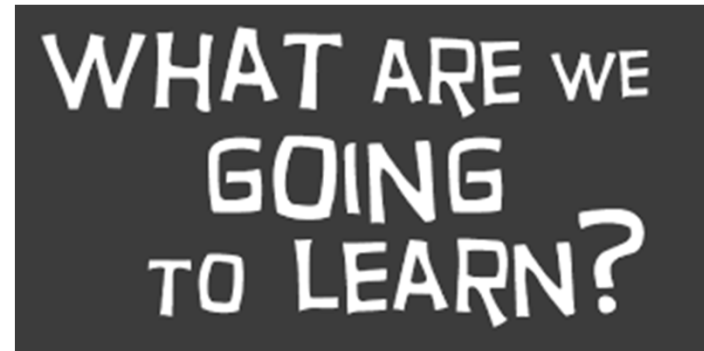
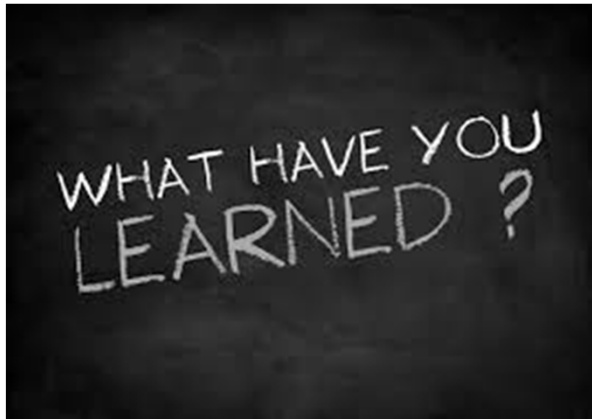
- **Policies on e-cigarettes and vaping-** It is our recommendation the schools increase the consequences for use of e-cigarettes and vaping paraphernalia. These apparatus can be used to deliver illegal substances and should be viewed in the same way as other drug paraphernalia in school discipline policy. In a 2015 survey of Cattaraugus County youth, 23.9% reported use of e-cigarettes.

- **Prevention Education** – Based on the 2015 survey of Cattaraugus County youth, there is a significant drop in the perception of risk or harm of substances between 8th and 9th grade (5% for alcohol and 13.2% for marijuana). It is the recommendation of the Coalition that schools insure high quality education on the risks of the use of substances in the middle school grades (6-8) as well as elementary grades (3-5) in order to address this drop. Members of the Coalition are able to provide this high quality education free of charge to districts, allowing districts to focus on educational standards.

- **Education on Substance of Choice** – Oftentimes, youth are not aware of the risk or harm of the substance they are found to have used or in possession of in school. It is the recommendation of the Coalition that, as part of their discipline, students should be required to conduct research on their substance of choice, paying particular attention to the consequences of use, and share this knowledge with school personnel, whether in the form of a paper or presentation. In order to achieve this, school districts may access Coalition members to provide supportive education and/or utilize online resources with fees that provide certificates of proof of education.
