Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent to conditionally appoint **Appointment Denise Straub**, who holds initial New York State Teaching Certificate in Generalist in Middle Childhood Education (Grades 5-9), as a Teacher in the Science tenure area for a four (4) year probationary period to commence on August 29, 2018 and end on August 29, 2022. Eligibility for tenure at the end of the probationary period is dependent on Denise receiving APPR ratings of Effective or Highly Effective in 3 of the 4 preceding years and no Ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year. The expiration date of this probationary appointment is tentative and conditional only. In order to be eligible and considered for tenure, the teacher must meet all requirements of education law and corresponding regulations. The salary will be paid in accordance with the salary schedule outlined in the collective bargaining agreement with the Allegany-Limestone Teachers' Association and the Board of Education in the amount of \$44,586 based upon Schedule B, Step 7 (Alyssa Mello).
